4. Patuxent Branch Trail Park – Located on Guilford Road near Gerwig Lane. This is a scenic, shaded park with several miles of bike / walking trails. Visitors can follow the trail to Savage or Lake Elkhorn. A branch of the Patuxent River runs through the park. No fees for this park.

5. Brunswick Bowl at 7100 Carved Way at Snowden River Parkway is not free; however with their coupons and specials you can bowl for a good hour or more at a discount or completely free, depending on the coupons used.

### Wegmans Opens Near Guilford on Sunday, June 17th

The new Wegmans grocery store will open June 17th in Columbia. Doors will open for the first time at 7 am.

Store Manager Wendy Webster radiates enthusiasm for the job. "Are you kidding?" she says. "It doesn't get any better than this." For the past year, she has overseen every aspect of the new Columbia store's development, from combing over blueprints of the 135,000 square-foot building to hiring and training the 650 new Wegmans employees who will join 50 transfers from other stores. Wegmans Columbia store at the intersection of Snowden River Parkway and McGaw Road will open on June 17<sup>th</sup> at 7 a.m.

Especially important to her, Webster says, has been the time spent reaching deep into the community to find out how Wegmans can become a good neighbor and friend. "Our team has already participated in a number of great local events, including fundraisers for United Way and Special Olympics," she says.

"Very meaningful is that we have established a strong connection with the Howard County Food Bank. In May, we donated 17,000 pounds of nonperishable food. One of our most important giving priorities for our company, and for me personally, is feeding the hungry."

Hiring for Columbia began in January. "About 20 languages are spoken by our team," says Webster. "The diversity truly reflects the local community. We

love the varied life experiences these people bring, and also how they will make everyone in Columbia and the surrounding county feel at home in the store."

Webster recently celebrated her 21st anniversary at Wegmans. A Rochester, NY native, she worked her way up through the ranks, beginning as a deli manager trainee. In 2005, after a stint as store manager in Corning, New York, she moved to Maryland to open the Hunt Valley market, Wegmans' first store in the state. "That was a real honor," she says. "Being the new kids in town, we knew we had to work extra hard to show people what Wegmans is all about."

The fact that Columbia will be Wegmans' fifth store in Maryland has not cooled her quest to earn customers' respect and loyalty. "We know we have to do our best every day," she says. "Customers in this area have a lot of choices. We're pulling out all the stops."

Among the special features of Wegmans Columbia store are a pub-style café, with counter and table seating, an expanded prepared foods section, a fresh-cut-to -order veggie market in the produce section, locally (Continued on Page 6)
