Summertime is upon us. Some parents in our area have the foresight and the resources to plan activities for their children during the summer months when school is not is session. There are various summer school programs and camps in our area, and others offered in other towns and out of state.

Some of the programs are day programs while others are overnight camping experiences. These camps range from basketball and other sports, to academic pursuits like engineering and science. Almost all of these camps are worth the cost. The experiences for the children are often exceptionally enriching and memorable.

Among those of us who fall into the struggling class, with just enough energy and resources to keep food on the table, all is not lost. With some parental guidance, you can keep your children busy throughout the summer for little of no money.

First of all, a little extra learning during the summer will not damage your children at all. Many children are in learning programs for at least part of the break. The public library is a great resource. You may want to implement a summer reading program. You can do this independently or do it in conjunction with your local library.

The books should be fun and of interest to the child. During the school year, the child typically does not have the opportunity to read for fun. The parent can award prizes for completing books. Implementing a storytelling element allows the child to demonstrate speaking skills and comprehension. Ask questions about the content. This exercise can be more fun and rewarding than you might imagine.

If you have young children, you can teach them new games to play. If you do not know any games, again the public library is the place to go. While your child is reading in the children's section you can look for books that teach games. The folks at the information desk will be able to help you.




